- ❖ Walking shorts only – no shorter than mid-thigh and no longer than top of knee cap
- ❖ Navy blue, black, tan, gray or khaki (green, olive, brown)
- ❖ May only be worn in the months of September, May and June

ALL STUDENTS

- ❖ Shirts or blouses must be tucked in at all times.
- ❖ Belts are optional.
- ❖ Socks must be worn at all times. This does include when sandals are worn.
- ❖ Boots are to be worn on snowy or wet days. Students must have a pair of shoes to change into for the classroom.
- ❖ No dangling earrings may be worn.
- ❖ Hairstyles must be groomed and styled in a traditional manner. Dyed, bleached or highlighted hair is not allowed.
- ❖ No make-up is to be worn.
- ❖ Only clear fingernail polish may be worn and on the west campus only.

STUDENTS MAY NOT WEAR

- ❖ Hats inside the classroom
- ❖ Mesh shirts
- ❖ Tee shirts
- ❖ Tank tops
- ❖ Sports jerseys
- ❖ Muscle shirts
- ❖ Halter tops
- ❖ Middy tops
- ❖ Spandex pants, shorts, body suits
- ❖ Fatigues
- ❖ Sweat outfits or sweatpants
- ❖ Shoes or sandals that are not secured to the feet (e.g. clogs, flip flops, jellies)
- ❖ Hoodies – except Providence wear and only from December 1-May 1
- ❖ Tube tops
- ❖ Tops with low cut neckline
- ❖ Sweatshirts – except Providence wear
- ❖ Fleece tops of any kind
- ❖ Oversized or baggy pants
- ❖ Jeans or jean shorts
- ❖ Cutoff, fringe shorts

CONSEQUENCES

All students (K-8) will conform to the dress code. Any student not abiding the dress code will have the following consequences:

West Campus students will receive one signature on their student accountability card.

East Campus students will receive a reminder from the teacher and if applicable, the principal.

All students and their families will receive verbal or written notification from the teacher with reference to the student not following Providence Catholic School dress code policy.

Please remember it is the parent's responsibility to ensure the child is in dress code. If there is any question as to whether the article is within dress code or not, do not purchase it/wear it. Rule of thumb is if you have to question it, we will have to question it.

MASS DAY APPAREL

From May 1st through September 30th shorts within the dress code may be worn to Mass at the discretion of the parent.

GYM CLOTHES

All students in grades 5-8 are required to wear gym clothes for Physical Education classes. T-shirts, shorts, sweat clothes, and wind suits are allowed for Phy. Ed. Gym shoes and socks must also be worn. Failure to be prepared for Phy. Ed. class may be reflected in the quarterly grade.

CASUAL DRESS DAYS

Casual dress days are scheduled the first Wednesday (of the month) throughout the year to allow students a "break" from the regular dress code. The attire for these days is casual, but still reflective of a Catholic school setting. This means that all attire must be in good condition (clean and without tears/holes). We want to allow our students free choice without looking 'sloppy.' Casual attire may be jeans and a t-shirt. However, that t-shirt must be appropriate for school and should not advertise rock groups, cigarettes, etc. They may have a logo on them. A plain, printed, or character t-shirt would be acceptable. Zipper vests, fleece, corduroy, and other casual styles are all acceptable. Girl's shirts must cover the midriff and not cut off at the beltline.

If your child comes to school in casual dress that does not portray our Catholic environment, they will be sent to the office until appropriate clothing can be brought to them by a parent or emergency contact. If you have any questions, please feel free to call the school office.

To help with the safety of our students the following will be the dismissal procedures:

East Campus Dismissal

- Bus students will be dismissed first. After the bus has left, students will be sent to the cars, three cars at a time, as is our current practice. All bus students will be put on the bus unless we have a note in writing.
- We are asking that each family place their name on a card and put the card in an obvious place for easy identification by teachers. Letters should be clearly written at least 4 inches high.
- If someone else is picking up a student, that person should also have the student's family name clearly visible.
- If parents or other adults come into school instead of driving up, those children will be dismissed after all of the cars have been loaded. This is for safety purposes.

West Campus Dismissal

- Bus students will be dismissed first. After the three buses have left the students will be sent to the cars once you pull up to the front of the school. All bus students will be put on the bus unless we have a written note.
- If someone else is picking up the student, we will need to know that information with a written note to the office.
- If parents or other adults come into school instead of driving up, those children will be dismissed after all of the cars have been loaded. This is for safety purposes.

**STUDENT IMMUNIZATION LAW
 AGE/GRADE REQUIREMENTS
 2010-2011 SCHOOL YEAR**

The following are the minimum required immunizations for each age/grade level. It is not a recommended immunization schedule for infants and preschoolers. For that schedule, contact your doctor or local health department.

DTP/DTaP/DT vaccine for children entering Kindergarten: Your child must have received one dose after the 4th birthday (either the 3rd, 4th, or 5th) to be compliant. (Note: a dose 4 days or less before the 4th birthday is also acceptable).

2. DTP/DTaP/DT/Td vaccine for students entering Pre K and grades 1 through 12: Four doses are required. However, if your child received the 3rd dose after the 4th birthday, further doses are not required. (Note: a dose 4 days or less before the 4th birthday is also acceptable).
3. Tdap means adolescent tetanus, diphtheria and acellular pertussis vaccine. If your child received a dose of a tetanus-containing vaccine, such as Td, within 5 years of entering the grade in which Tdap is required, your child is compliant and a dose of Tdap vaccine is not required.
4. Polio vaccine for students entering grades Kindergarten through 12: Four doses are required. However, if your child received the 3rd dose after the 4th birthday, further doses are not required. (Note: a dose 4 days or less before the 4th birthday is also acceptable).
5. The first dose of MMR vaccine must have been received on or after the first birthday (Note: a dose 4 days or less before the 1st birthday is also acceptable).
6. Var means Varicella (chickenpox) vaccine. A history of chickenpox disease is also acceptable

*Effective starting with the 2009-2010 school year, **new** families entering PCS that are not registered with one of our four supporting parishes will be subject to non-parishioner tuition rates. Families enrolled at PCS during the 2008-2009 will not be subjected to non-parishioner rates for the 2009-2010 school year or for any subsequent school year regardless of parishioner status for as long as they maintain continuous enrollment at PCS.

- **Effective this school year there will be a shuttle fee of \$20.00 per semester, per student. This fee is only for the students who do not ride a PCS provided school bus to and from home/school.**

In order to keep bussing fees at a minimum, parents are encouraged to contribute to Providence the transportation refund check received from their public school district if applicable. Since incorporating this practice, Providence has been able to offset costs and keep bussing fees at a minimum.

(ALL FEES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE.)

Finders Fee – any person who refers a family and that family in turn registers and attends the referring party will receive a \$100.00 deduction from their tuition and fees bill.

As a Catholic School, we rely on fundraisers, private donations and grants to supplement our budget for programs and materials for our students. We require our parents to participate in fundraising efforts and to volunteer a minimum of nine hours throughout the school year.
